Lastly, I congratulate the office bearers of YES for their endeavors, urge them to work for the benefit of unemployed youths in our community with innovative ideas, and renewed dedication.

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1.DEPARTMENT INTRODUCTION

The Department of Home, Central Tibetan Administration was established in 1960. It was one of the first Departments to be established in exile and was given the task of coordinating relief and rehabilitation works of thousands of Tibetan refugees who fled Tibet to neighboring countries of India, Nepal and Bhutan.

With expansion of the scope and nature of its continuing responsibilities of looking after the welfare and rehabilitation of Tibetan refugees in exile, it was registered in 1981 as a non-profit charitable society called "His Holiness the Dalai Lama's Central Tibetan Relief Committee (CTRC)" under the under Indian Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. It now effectively acts as the Relief and Development agency of the Central Tibetan Administration.

The main objectives of the CTRC are to co-ordinate and mobilize individual donors, voluntary agencies and Government assistance for the welfare and rehabilitation of Tibetan Refugees in exile. It also works towards making the Tibetan settlements in exile viable and sustainable by ushering in socio-economic development of the Tibetan communities in exile.

2.YES BACKGROUND

With the increasing number of school and college dropouts which in a way lead to rising rate of unemployment in our Tibetan community, it was felt necessary to provide vocational employable skills trainings to the unemployed Tibetan youths to make them self-reliant.

The ever increasing population of unemployed youths has become a serious issue in the Tibetan community and it is increasingly difficult for the school dropouts to find a decent livelihood without an institutional support. In most of the Tibetan settlements, a large part of workforce remains either idle or not engaging in any meaningful livelihood oriented activities. This situation puts the community at risk from threats of alcoholism, drug abuse, and other socially undesirable activities. It is therefore necessary to provide the unemployed youths with skills training and encourage them to set up small enterprises through micro-credit facility to make them engaged and become contributing member of the community.

The program for addressing issues of unemployed Tibetan youths was initially launched as Promotional Agency for Development of Micro Enterprises (PADME) by the then Planning Council of the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) in 1997. The responsibility for the management of the program was later given to the Central Tibetan Relief Committee (CTRC) on 7April 2003 and Youth Empowerment Support (YES) Section came into being as a result.



The main objective of the YES program is to promote gainful employment to the unemployed Tibetan youths in settlements who are school dropouts or have failed to complete their formal education by providing them with relevant skills training and start-up loans for setting up of micro-enterprises in the settlements.

Norwegian Church Aid (NCA) has very actively funded skills training and alternative employment generation programs of the CTRC from 1998 to 2016. The YES program is currently being fully supported and funded by U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) under a program to strengthen self-reliance and resilience of Tibetan communities in south Asia.

2.1 AIMS/OBJECTIVE OF YES

To empower youths through appropriate career guidance, promotion & support of self-managed enterprises

- To motivate youths to have a positive outlook & engage in diverse economic activities
- To impart relevant skills training to unemployed youths
- To coordinate suitable job placement for interested youths.
- To provide start-up loans to set up micro-enterprises

The skills training programs under YES are currently implemented in two training centers namely the Bengaluru based Institute of Small Trade Learning (ISTL) and Tibetan Career Center (TCC) in Dharamsala. Training programs for motor driving and other such trainings are also being undertaken at the settlement level depending on the availability of the funding partners.





3. INSTITUTE FOR SMALL TRADE LEARNING (ISTL)



It is a residential vocational training institute based in Neelamangala, Bangalore. Every year 90 to 110 trainees from different Tibetan settlements complete various skill training programs from the Institute. The institute also provides placement to the trainees after completion of their trainings. The placement rate of the ISTL has been remarkably high in the past.

3.1 COURSES OFFERED AT ISTL

Course Brief Contents: Hair structures, skin & scalp disorder treatments, health in salon, consultation, etiquette, retailing, hairdressing tools, long hairdressing equipment's, roller setting, shampoos, conditioners, methodology, blow-dry, technical and various haircuts.

Scope: She/he can set-up Hair salon or get employed in related trade.



Course Name : BEAUTICIAN (JAWED HABIB CERTIFIED)

Course Brief Contents: Manicures, pedicures, facials, eyebrows threading, bleaching, waxing, shampoos & conditioning, hair structure, styling, cuts & coloring, perm & neutralize hair, various massages (leg, hand, head, back, stomach & body), various make up/make over (eye, remedial, camouflage, photography, evening, model, bridal), first aid, hygiene & health, sanitation & sterilization, bacteriology, nutrition, anatomy & physiology, cells, skin biology, science & disorders, nail science, color chemistry.

Scope: She/he can set-up Beauty parlor/shop or get employed in related trade.

Course Name	:	BASIC & ADVANCE COURSE IN COOKERY
Duration	:	6 months
Eligibility	:	Class X th pass
Seat Vacance	:	8 per batch

Course Brief Contents : Basic & advance courses in Indian, Continental & Chinese cuisines, Bread Baking, Cakes & Pastries etc.

Scope: She/he can set-up Restaurant, Cafe, and Catering or employed in Hotel industries.

Course Name : GRAPHIC AND WEB DESIGNING (GWD)

Duration	:	1 year
Eligibility	:	Class XII th pass

Course Brief Contents: CERTIFICATE IN GRAPHIC DESIGN (SEMESTER I) lays the foundation for learning Graphic Designing for print & publishing. The students will acquire concepts of digital graphics and equip them with thorough knowledge of creating image-editing and publishing graphics for various industries. MODULES: Concepts of Graphics & Illustrations, Digital Design, Basic Arts, Creating Illustrations, Print Design - Composition & Layout & Design Portfolio. SOFTWARES TAUGHT: Adobe Photoshop Extended Adobe Illustrator and CORAL-DRAW.

CERTIFICATE IN WEB & INTERACTIVE DESIGN (SEMESTER II) the students learn



to design interactive websites, portals and multimedia presentations. MODULES: Concepts of interface & interactive Design, Designing concepts for Websites, Web Designing, Web weaver, Web Graphics & animation, Web Scripting & Interactivity, Developing Interactive Web Pages and Web Portfolio. SOFTWARES TAUGHT: HTML, Dreamweaver, Flash and Java Script.

Scope: There is a continuous demand for design professionals with graphic art computer skills to produce designs, symbols, User Interface (UI), typhography, Illustration and Photography for use in print and electronic publication.. There is also a huge requirement for Web site designers using multimedia and animation in the internet publishing industries.

Course Brief Contents: Front Office Management: Involving guest arrivals, registration, reservation, billing, dealings with cashiers, uniformed services, business center etc.

Housekeeping: Involves general cleanliness and maintenance of hotel property, maintenance of rooms, preparation of rooms for new guests, Guest room cleaning procedures, maintain linen and uniform rooms, Public Area cleaning, knowledge & practice, cleaning agents, pest control, control of laundry service and other housekeeping knowledge including textiles, horticulture, safety and security steps.

Food & Beverage Service: Study of Restaurant, organization of restaurant, types of restaurant & bars, restaurant service equipment's types of food service, menu, restaurant procedures, room service, banquets & oudoor service hygiene & sanitation, beverage spirits, non-alcoholic beverages bar services.Food production: Deals with kitchen organization, kitchen staff, sauces, soups & garnish recipes, methods of cooking, Nutrition etc.

Scope: Great scope to get placement in star Hotels with good salary and other benefits. Hard working staff will get quick promotions.

3.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Skill training application forms are available with all the Tibetan settlement offices or you can download them from www.centraltibetanreliefcommittee.org. Application forms and all the subordinate documents are required to be submitted through concerned settlement offices. The Settlement offices will recommend the application forms and other subordinate documents to the Department of Home after necessary verification. The YES selection committee of the Department of Home will do the preliminary selection and will notify the shortlisted candidates to all the settlements with reporting date for the interview. The shortlisted applicants will be interviewed at the Institute for Small Trade Learning, Nelamangala for final selection. The selected candidates must submit a security deposit of Rs. 5000 at the training center which will be refunded after the successful completion of training. In addition to this, a monthly administration and training fee of Rs. 1500 per trainee will have to be paid to the ISTL after passing final interview.

The selected candidates will be provided free training, food and accommodation, local conveyance and travelling expenses as well.

3.4 OTHER SHORT TERM EMPLOYABILITY SKILL TRAINING PROVIDED

AT ISTL

- Apart from the above major trainings provided at the ISTL, short term workshops or soft skills are also provided to the trainees which are as follows:
- Motivational Workshop (motivates the youths towards self-reliance. To relay positive messages, boost their morale, and enhance their attitude)
- Introduction of Tibetan Buddhism (invites Tibetan Scholars to give talks on the basics of Tibetan Buddhism)
- Career Counseling (Invites Department of Education, CTA Career Counselors to give talks on Pre & Post training counseling, Resume writing, Personality Development, Interview Tips etc.)
- Business management training (Basic business concepts are taught)
- Basic book keeping and financial management Training. (Basic accounts management and book keeping are taught)
- Conflict Resolution (Invites Tibetan Centre for Conflict Resolution (TCCR) to give awareness talks on conflict resolution to enable the youths to integrate into mainstream of the society)
- Spoken English (Trains in English speaking)
- Communication, confidence and personality development training are also provide.
- Women empowerment related workshops are also provided. (Women empowerment desk of the CTA organizes such workshops)





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
ISTL Trained & Placement Records (2007 - 2017)


4. YES -TIBETAN CAREER CENTRE

The Tibetan career center (TCC) is a project initiated by Techno serve, an international organization in collaboration with the Department of Home, Central Tibetan Administration in the year 2012-2013. Due to the success of the project and its positive impact on the community, the Department of Home, Central Tibetan Administration has decided to continue it to enable more Tibetan youths to avail the opportunities to boost their employability skills available under TCC project based in Dharamsala.

This project came up after a research study carried out by Techno serve in 23 Tibetan settlements in India and found that 60% of Tibetan youths are either seasonally employed or completely unemployed. This is a grave problem which needs to be addressed accordingly.

4.1 OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

To sustain Tibetan youths in general and unemployed Tibetan youths in particular who are deprived of opportunities and information in terms of relevant skill oriented trainings and professional career development skills.






4.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The application forms for various skill-training programs are available at the Tibetan Career Centre. Application forms and subordinate documents are required to be submitted at the Centre or can be submitted through mail or by post. TCC notifies the availability of training courses through its official Facebook pages 'TCC Head & TCC Dharamsala and through posters.


Applicants for Hair dressing course must get their application forms and required documents verified and attested by their respective settlement officers. For hair dressing course, selected applicant are required to pay Rs.13,000 for the 4 month course which will be utilized for purchasing hair dressing related equipment and supplies for the individual trainees. Since the seats available for the courses offered at the TCC are limited, we select candidate based on their education background and the status of their unemployment. However, applicants who are recent arrivals from Tibet are given due preference.

4.3 COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

Under this program, career counseling is provided to unemployed Tibetan youths and school and college going students. In addition, parental counseling is also provided to the parents in 20 different Tibetan settlements across India. The TCC also disseminates information about the various job opportunities available in the Tibetan community and in the market through which the job aspirants are connected to the prospective employer.







4.4 HAIR DRESSING TRAINING CENTER





The 3-month introductory Jawed Habib certified hairdressing-training program is part of a larger initiative of the Tibetan Career Centre to reduce unemployment among young Tibetans in exile. The certification is done under the Jawed Habib Foundations.

At the end of the training students will be eligible for jobs at top hairdressing salons around the country. The center has spacious saloon space with fully equipped facilities, which can accommodate up to 20 students at a time. Jawed Habib academy is one of the top saloons nationally as well as internationally, with one stop destination for all hair styling needs for women, men and children.

4.5 COMPUTER TRAINING CENTER

The center provides computer training to the students under the certification of Institute for Advanced Computer Technology (IACT) where course such as

- Four month Diploma in Web Designing,
- One month Indesign computer course,
- One month Basic computer course (BCC),
- One month Tally accounting software program




• One-month certificate in Photoshop.

Apart from above, basic English/Tibetan typing and basic computer fundamentals are exclusively taught to the trainees who do not have the minimum requirement to avail the certification from the IACT. Thus, this training is also helpful to the newly arrived Tibetans from Tibet and those who do not possess the minimum required educational qualifications








5. SOME OF THE SUCCESS STORIES

6. YES MICRO-CREDIT

- Micro-credit scheme was initiated with the primary objective of providing low interest loans to the unemployed and capable Tibetan youths to start their own Micro enterprises to earn a livelihood. The program is open to individuals in the age range of 18 -40 years.
- Priorities are given to those individuals who have undergone skills training under the YES program and are looking forward to setting up the same enterprise within their own settlements or in the radius of 300 Kms from their settlement.
- Detailed business plan is required to be submitted as per the given business plan format.
- The ceiling for the micro-credit is set at

₹ Rs. 100,000/- for an individual enterprise,

₹ Rs. 300,000/- for a partnership of 2 individuals, and

₹ Rs. 500,000/- for a group of more than 3 individuals or more

• A nominal interest of 3 % per annum is charged on the capital with the maximum repayment period of 5 years. The repayment schedule is mandatory for each loan depending upon the nature of the enterprises. All possible legal agreements are secured to run the disbursement system smoothly.

Loan application forms are available with all the Settlement Offices or can be downloaded from www.centraltibetanreliefcommettee.org. Local YES Micro loan committee headed by the Settlement officer has to recommend loan application and submit all the related documents to the Department of Home, CTA's Central loan approving committee. After thorough verification, the Department of Home Central loan approving committee will decide on the loan amount, interest, duration and repayment of the loan. The loan amount will be released through the Settlement office and local YES REPRO (Regional Program Officer) will monitor the program. Loan can be applied at any time of the year.




Ever since the YES micro credit program was started, it has benefitted 249 Tibetan youths in starting their own businesses in and around the settlements. Loan amount of more than 26 million rupees were given to 249 Tibetan youths. This financial arrangement has not only benefited the individual applicant but it will surely have a positive impact on larger socio economic fabric of the settlement. The loan program is implemented as per the Loan guidelines formulated by the Kashag.




7. OTHER PROGRAM OF YES

7.1 OPEN BASIC EDUCATION (OBE)

Youth Empowerment support (YES) section of the Department of Home, Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) in collaboration with Dharamsala based Tibet Charity initiated an open basic Education (OBE), Computer courses, beginner and Intermediate English classes for newly arrived Tibetans from Tibet in the year 2013.

The program was started for the newly arrived Tibetans from Tibet to help them overcome language difficulties they face in India and more importantly to motivate them to join mainstream schools to pursue higher studies. The program is also extended to unemployed Tibetan youths in the settlements who have not been able to complete their primary education.









7.2 MOTOR DRIVING

For any community to thrive and prosper, its workforce should have a diversified set of skills aligned to the market and need of the community. Motor driving training program was implemented in 33 Tibetan settlements across India for 286 Tibetan youths in the year 2014 and 2017 as an added skill and also to earn a living from it.


